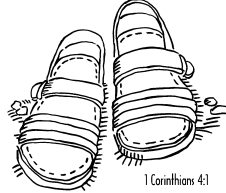

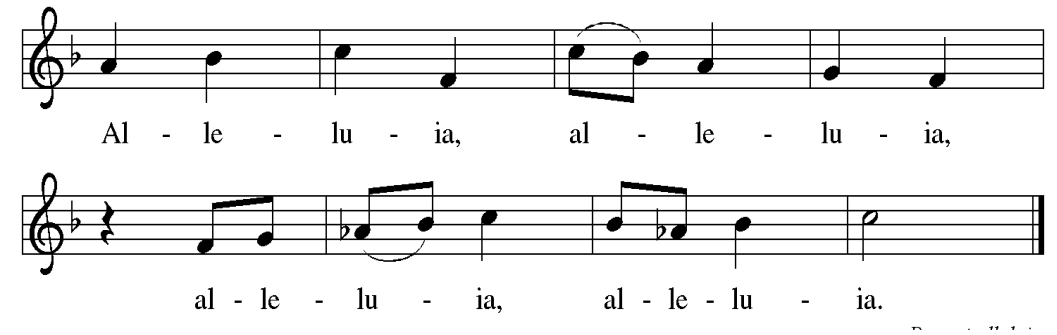

 Son, but only the Father. <sup>33</sup>Beware, keep alert; for you do not know when the time will  
 come. <sup>34</sup>It is like a man going on a journey, when he leaves home and puts his slaves in  
 charge, each with his work, and commands the doorkeeper to be on the watch.  
<sup>35</sup>Therefore, keep awake — for you do not know when the master of the house will  
 come, in the evening, or at midnight, or at cockcrow, or at dawn, <sup>36</sup>or else he may find  
 you asleep when he comes suddenly. <sup>37</sup>And what I say to you I say to all: Keep awake."


