NCEON (pronounced *neon*) stands for North County
Emergency Outreach Network. Established in 1989, it is
a non-profit, all volunteer Christian organization,
comprised of more than 36 churches and 6 civic
organizations from Glen Burnie, Hanover, Linthicum,
Pasadena, and Severn.

NCEON's purpose is to assist the neediest of our
community. The types of help NCEON gives are: Court
Ordered Eviction Assistance, Utility Shut-Off Notices,
Fuel Assistance, Medications, Food, Budget Counseling,
Pastoral Counseling, Referrals & Homeless Programs.

NCEON's ultimate goal is not be needed!

NCEON does not receive any government funds, they are all donated by member, or "Covenant" churches, organizations and private individuals.

Glen Lutheran Church signed a "covenant", along with other churches in the area at NCEON's inception, pledging to support the organization with money, donations and volunteer support whenever possible.

As a small congregation, Glen Lutheran Church alone is not able to offer much assistance to the needy of our community. We can join with others, however to make a larger impact, and we do just that by supporting NCEON.

Our congregation voted to support NCEON this year by placing NCEON donations in our budget in the amount of \$1200 in cash assistance, to be paid after other obligations for the year.
